An evaluation of the project is required in order to assess the relevance and impact of project activities, and define how and where to focus the development programme of Help The Needy Charitable Trust so that it can reap greatest benefit.

Provides relief to victims of natural disasters, armed conflict and famine and provision of safe water, shelter, education, sustainable livelihood healthcare.

2. OVERALL AIM OF EVALUATION

The overall purpose of the evaluation is to analyze the relevance and impact of projects funded by Help The Needy Charitable Trust, and to assess the overall effectiveness of the capacity building approach to NGOs;

Specific objectives of the evaluation will be:

To assess the overall approach, quality and efficiency of implementation

The evaluation will assess product, process and impact. It will identify factors that impeded impact at each level and make suggestions to address them in future projects. Through a series of case studies, part of this process will be to assess the impact of activities at beneficiary level.

To identify future directions for the project(s) to ensure the sustainability of Help The Needy Charitable Trust funding for international development projects.

To identify and analyze current and anticipated consequences and effects of projects at field level and distill lessons learned for replication or adaptation;

3. METHODOLOGY & REPORTING

The independent evaluator (external or internal) or Evaluation Team (structure of the team is described in detail in Section 6) as recommended by Help The Needy Charitable Trust Overseas Department, in consultation with colleagues (other local NGOs or Organizations) supporting the process, will develop the evaluation methodology, which should include, at a minimum, the following:

Review of project documents

Consideration of proposed actual outcomes

Field visits, to be used to generating at least three case studies; Use of qualitative tools to measure impact e.g. key informant interviews, Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) and focus group discussions;



Use of questionnaires or surveys to measure the impact of activities

- The case studies will focus on the following criteria:
- Assess what difference the project material and training/capacity building process has made for beneficiaries,
- Assess the inter-agency approach as an effective mechanism for the project and its sustainability,
- Assess any impact that the project had on elements of programmes, e.g. quality of analysis, decision-making, consultation, coordination, allocation of resources,
- Assess the impact of programmes that have used the in capacity building activities directly with beneficiaries.
- Assess the types of activities that have been developed in-country, identifying those that could be of interest for replication elsewhere.
- The evaluation report shall follow the structure given in annex 1.

4. OUTPUTS

The Consultant (Evaluation Team) would be responsible for ensuring the delivery of:

- 1. Three field based case studies;
- 2. An evaluation report of between 15 and 25 pages, plus annexes including:
- An executive summary (of no more than 1 page);
- Findings and recommendations;
- Background and operating environment



6. EVALUATION TEAM MEMBERS

The evaluation team will be composed of an external or internal expert or combination of both. Evaluators will maintain the highest possible professional and personal standards. In particular, they will ensure the honesty and integrity of the evaluation process, and respect the security and dignity of the stakeholders with whom they interact. Information and documentation gathered in the course of an evaluation project may not be used for any other purpose without the prior permission of the Head of Help The Needy Charitable Trust Overseas Department.

Help The Needy Charitable Trust will support Independent Project Evaluation which is an activity carried out during and/ or at the end of the project cycle, which attempts to determine as systematically and objectively as possible the relevance, efficiency, achievements (outputs, outcomes and impact) and sustainability of the project.

The evaluation assesses the achievements of the project against its key objectives, as set in the Project document, including re-examination of the relevance of the objectives and of the design. It will also identify factors that have facilitated or impeded the achievement of the objectives.


- Approach and overall philosophy of the project funded;

- Communication at all levels;
- Scope and delivery of training (people reached, organizations involved and methods used);
- Review broader organizational training strategies and the position of the project in these;
- Review how gender and rights-based themes are incorporated in the project.

Future direction

- What should be the focus of the project in the future?
- How could strengthened ownership and sustainability of the project be established at all levels?
- How should the activities promoted through the project be replicated and multiplied in the future and materials kept relevant and up-to-date?

7.3 Project Evaluation

• The project-wide evaluation will address the following issues:



- There is an agreement among the stakeholders that the objectives of the project are still valid and that the programme supports the country industrial strategy.
- The programme did and continues to meet the Help The Needy Charitable Trust international targets and is related to Help The Needy Charitable Trust's corporate strategy.
- The programme is complementary with relevant bilateral and multilateral cooperation and coordination programmes.

7.3.2 Funds Mobilization

- The central management and counterparts were able and willing, to contribute (in kind and/or cash) to project implementation and in taking an active part in funds mobilization.
- Help The Needy Charitable Trust Head Office and the Field representation paid adequate attention to and were effective in funds mobilization.
- The project team and its stakeholders were in a position to participate in the process of allocation of seed money.

- Must be self-explanatory
- Not more than one page focusing on the most important findings and recommendations
- Overview matrix showing strengths and weaknesses of the integrated participation.

Introduction

- Information on the evaluation: why, when, by whom, etc
- Information sources and availability of information
- Methodological remarks and validity of the findings

Project Summary

- Fact sheet (component/project structure, objectives, donors, counterparts, timing, cost, etc)
- Brief description including history and previous cooperation
- Context: Situation of the country; major changes in framework conditions

Funds Mobilization

- Individual components
- Project

Project Identification and Formulation

- Individual components
- Project

Implementation of Individual components/ Projects

- Relevance, ownership, reaching target groups, sustainability, management, outputs, outcome, impact (by component or project, as appropriate)
- Overview table showing performances by components

Implementation of the Project

- Internal and external coordination, synergy effects
- Identity, degree of integration, visibility
- Policy relevance, ownership, reaching target groups, sustainability
- Overview matrix showing strengths and weaknesses of the project implementation
- Issues with regard to next phase II (if applicable)



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
